BPW Resolutions By Laws & Public Affairs Update

BPW Canada 2025 Virtual AGM

n August 23, members from across the country joined our **eight-hour virtual AGM marathon**. Delegates debated, voted, and powered through a full day of BPW business.

Special thanks to **Linda Ford** and **Lubna Sami** for representing the Brampton Caledon Club delegation. Lubna also secured an in-person hub in North Toronto, allowing delegates to share food, laughter, and teamwork — making a long day feel lighter. Thank you, Lubna!

Brampton Caledon's National Wins

- ✓ Single Seniors & Federal Tax Fairness Passed Unanimously
- ✓ Criminalization of Coercive Control Passed (96%)
- ✓ Standing with Afghan Women & Girls Passed (79%)
- ✓ Emergency: Gendered Impact of AI Passed (79%)

Why it matters: These resolutions champion tax fairness, protect women in abusive relationships, stand with Afghan women, and push for federal action on Al's gendered impacts.

Other resolutions, including those on immigrant women's credential recognition, leadership, and health care policy enhancements, were also passed, demonstrating the strength of national collaboration. One resolution was withdrawn on Human Trafficking, as clubs would like to partner and strengthen before resubmitting again.

Next steps: BPW Canada's Resolutions Committee will prepare bilingual briefs for the federal government, opposition parties, and allied organizations. This information will be available on the BPW Canada website.

BPW Ontario 2025 Conference & AGM

The Ontario Conference opened virtually on September 11 with provincial resolutions. Thank you to **Linda Ford, Lubna Sami, Kim McDermott, and Jocelyne Desautels (Niagara Falls)** for representing the Brampton Caledon delegation team!

- Affordable Housing for Women in Ontario North Toronto
- 3. Commendation for Hon. Charmaine Williams, MPP (Brampton) Brampton Caledon

Public Affairs: What's New

Digital Safety & Gendered Harm

A 2025 Canadian Women's Foundation report found that:

- 61% of women and gender-diverse people in Canada have faced online harassment, hate speech, stalking, or hacking.
- 43% reported anxiety or depression as a result.
- Disproportionate impacts were seen among Black, Indigenous, racialized, 2SLGBTQIA+, youth, and persons with disabilities.

Supporting Women with Disabilities

On **August 14, 2025**, when the Honourable Rechie Valdez (Minister of Women and Gender Equality) and Chi Nguyen (MP for Spadina—Harbourfront) publicly announced the \$656,053 funding to Realize's "Breaking Barriers" project, which tackles systemic obstacles facing women with recurring disabilities — enhancing their workplace inclusion, economic security, and leadership opportunities.

FIRST VICE PRESIDENT & INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS: Amanda Graham-Rowe

KIVA Project: Empowering Women Worldwide:
BPW Brampton Caledon continues to make a global impact through its support of women entrepreneurs via Kiva microloans. We currently have three active loans helping women improve their livelihoods and strengthen their communities:

1. Sustainable Artisan Development Project (Peru)

- Purpose: Training, market access, and income support for 250+ artisans
- Loan Amount: USD\$250
- Repayment status \$34.77 repaid; currently behind schedule
- Note: Originally due December 2025 awaiting revised repayment schedule

2. Madina (Tajikistan)

- Purpose: X-ray specialist upgrading equipment to meet demand and improve healthcare access
- Loan Amount: USD\$125
- Repayment Status: \$29.33 repaid; on
 - schedule
- Expected Full Repayment: October 2026

3. Gloria (Ghana)

- Purpose: Expanding mobile money business to meet customer demand
- Loan Amount: USD\$125
- **Repayment Status:** Repayment begins December 1, 2025
- Expected Full Repayment: September 2026
- Social Impact: Gloria will volunteer 2.5 hours/week as a CAMFED Agriculture Guide, training young women in sustainable farming

Looking Ahead:

As part of our **2026 budget**, BPW Brampton Caledon has approved an additional **USD \$500** to support more women entrepreneurs globally. Stay tuned for updates as we roll out these new loans and continue our mission to empower women through economic opportunity.

<u>BPW International Updates – October 2025</u> Celebrating 95 Years of BPW

BPW International marked its 95th anniversary with the global campaign "We Are BPW: 95 Years of Courage, Vision, and Unity." Clubs worldwide contributed stories and group photos, highlighting the organization's legacy of empowering women through advocacy, leadership, and community.

Strategic Partnership with UN Women

BPW International signed a global Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with UN Women to collaborate on gender equality and women's entrepreneurship. This partnership includes the development of a global network of start-up centers for female entrepreneurs, with pilot programs already underway in Sierra Leone, Niger, and DR Congo. Promoting Peace & Equality In recognition of International Day of Peace (Sept 20), BPW released six action points encouraging members to promote peace through local engagement. On International Equal Pay Day (Sept 17), BPW renewed its commitment to closing the gender pay gap globally.

Youth & Climate Leadership

BPW continues to support young climate leaders through two fully funded global training programs:

- Climate Finance Academy 2025 (Virtual)
- Equitable Climate Transitions Training

These initiatives aim to equip youth with tools to lead inclusive and sustainable climate solutions.
